Join us for a special evening as we present the inaugural Massachusetts Storyteller Award, which honors an outstanding individual or group that is using the humanities and the power of the narrative to tackle the commonwealth's most pressing challenges.

This year's awardee is the Mashpee Wampanoag Tribe, represented by David Weeden, whose work weaves together storytelling and the urgency of climate action.

The Mashpee Wampanoag Tribe

is a vital part of the Wampanoag Nation, dedicated to preserving its culture, language, and heritage. It actively participates in governance, advocating for Indigenous rights



on the Cape Cod Commission, and plays a key role in historic preservation and community development.

David Weeden, a leader with over 20 years of experience in construction and project management, serves as a Tribal Councilman, Mashpee Selectboard member, and Native American Representative on the Cape Cod Commission. He is known for his dedication, including his recent project, "Across Generations: Mashpee Wampanoag Hunting and Fishing", funded by a Mass Humanities grant.

New Bedford is the frontline for coastal energy in Massachusetts. It's also a humanities city with diverse cultures, institutions, and stories, making it the ideal place to connect the people in libraries, museums, and cultural spaces across the state with people in the climate sector to galvanize support for this challenge.


